ARCHAEOLOGY POLICY OF INDIAN CAMP RANCH HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION

SUBJECT: Adoption of a policy and procedures for conducting Archaeological Work.

PURPOSE: To clarify the archaeological guidelines set forth in the Association's Declaration.

AUTHORITY: The Declaration, Articles of Incorporation, and Bylaws of the Association and

Colorado Law

EFFECTIVE DATE: DECEMBER 22, 2021

RESOLUTION: The Association hereby adopts the following procedures regarding archaeological work on Indian Camp Ranch. These are:

- Landowner agrees to consult with a qualified archaeologist to supervise any work done
 at Indian Camp Ranch. With the Board's approval, this person may be a Registered
 Professional Archaeologist, a Permitted Archaeologist, or a similarly academically qualified archaeologist. This person must be allowed to work in Colorado
- 2. The ICR Board of Directors must approve in advance the selected archaeologist recommended by the chairman of the archaeological committee to supervise the landowner and the proposed archaeological project.
- 3. Landowner agrees to have all work done according to minimum standards of responsible archaeology, which includes a project description, curation plan, and a plan for inadvertent discovery of human remains.
- 4. For details concerning minimum standards of responsible archaeology and a plan for inadvertent human remains, consult with the Archaeological Chairman of ICR.
- 5. Landowner and approved archaeologist must specify as to ownership and curation of archaeological materials and records obtained from the site.
