

Agreement to Permit Archaeological Fieldwork (Research) and Conveyance of Archaeological
Materials Recovered

Between:

Crow Canyon Archaeological Center (Crow Canyon), 23390 Road K, Cortez, CO 81321

and

Karen Kristin (the Landowner), 10275 Road 21.9, Cortez, CO 81321

WHEREAS, Crow Canyon is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization whose mission is to advance knowledge of the human experience through archaeological research, education programs, and collaboration with American Indians; and

WHEREAS, Crow Canyon is committed to making the results of its research available to the public at the local, national, and international levels; and

WHEREAS, Crow Canyon is committed to curating the materials collected through its research for public appreciation and future study by researchers; and

WHEREAS, archaeological research on private lands is essential to understanding the ancient peoples of the U.S. Southwest, and painstaking scientific study of the materials recovered from such sites will further our understanding of the deep history of this region and expand our knowledge of the human experience overall; and

WHEREAS, the willingness of private landowners to allow archaeological research at sites on their land and convey the recovered materials demonstrates their interest in the ancient peoples of the U.S. Southwest and their willingness to share new knowledge of these peoples with all Americans; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Camp Ranch Homeowners Association has given Crow Canyon permission to conduct archaeological field research on Basketmaker III sites (in the "Agreement to Permit Archaeological Fieldwork [Research] and Execute Agreements with Individual Landowners," fully executed July 13, 2010); and

AND WHEREAS, the Landowner(s) owns the Kristin property on which the archaeological sites specified in this agreement occur;

NOW, THEREFORE, Crow Canyon and the landowner execute this agreement, which describes the terms under which archaeological fieldwork will be undertaken at specified sites, and permanently conveys the ownership of all recovered materials and data to Crow Canyon.

(1) The Landowner(s) agrees:

- (a) To permit the Crow Canyon Archaeological Center and its staff to conduct archaeological research, including, but not limited to, remote sensing, surface collection, and excavation of all or portions of the following sites:

5MT10718, Basketmaker III habitation
5MT10719, Basketmaker III habitation

Once excavation units have been selected and laid out on the ground at 5MT10718 and 5MT10719, the Landowner will have the opportunity to review, modify, and approve their locations and extent.

And only remote sensing, soil augering, and surface collection at the following sites, with the possibility of further work to be proposed.

5MT10716, Basketmaker III habitation
5MT10715, possible transitional Basketmaker III–Pueblo I habitation

- (b) To allow the continuation of such research on the above described site(s) until completion with an understanding that such activity will not continue beyond December 31, 2012 without the Landowners' written consent.
- (c) To allow Crow Canyon to bring the vehicles, equipment, staff, and excavation-program participants (as defined in (2)(c) below) necessary for the conduct of the fieldwork onto their property. Permission to access the sites referenced in (1)(a), above, is granted only for Crow Canyon staff and consultants, not for public entry or for tours, except by specific request in writing with permission granted in writing by the Landowner.
- (d) To work with Crow Canyon staff to establish routes of ingress and egress to the sites, to define rest areas for staff and participants, and to establish areas for temporary equipment storage, and to avoid all trees and shrubs over one foot in height.
- (e) To work with Crow Canyon staff to protect fieldwork at sites on their land from damage or disruption due to trespass, vandalism, fire, and livestock grazing.
- (f) To release Crow Canyon from all liability associated with unaccompanied visits by the landowner(s) and their friends and/or associates to the sites during the period of fieldwork.

- (g) To unconditionally convey to Crow Canyon, for scientific and educational purposes and for permanent curation, all archaeological materials and data recovered during research at the above sites.
- (h) To work in good faith with Crow Canyon staff to resolve any issues which may arise that are not specified by other items in this agreement to the satisfaction of both parties.

(2) CROW CANYON ARCHAEOLOGICAL CENTER agrees:


- (a) To conduct all archaeological fieldwork at the sites specified above in accordance with current professional standards, as defined by the Society for American Archaeology Code of Ethics and the Register of Professional Archaeologists Code of Conduct and Standards of Research Performance.
- (b) To have a Registered Professional Archaeologist (RPA) administer the fieldwork.
- (c) That all visits to the sites are limited to Crow Canyon staff and excavation-program participants and will not exceed 10 in number at any one time. The sites are not open to tours by the public or Crow Canyon's non-excavation program participants except by specific request in writing with permission granted in writing by the Landowner
- (d) To limit excavations to only one site at a time.
- (e) To complete archaeological fieldwork in a timely manner and not later than December 31, 2012, without the written consent of the Landowner to extend the terms of this agreement to a later date. This document expires December 31, 2012.
- (f) To carry a minimum of \$1,000,000 general liability insurance to cover Crow Canyon's activities at the sites(s).
- (g) To confine our activities to the immediate area of the site(s).
- (h) To keep the fieldwork area tidy and to keep the overall impact of our activities to a minimum.
- (i) To remove all equipment from the site(s) prior to the completion of fieldwork.
- (j) To backfill and recontour the site(s), with landscaping fabric placed at the base of the excavated units, to blend with surrounding terrain and facilitate re-exposure of the excavations if the landowner(s) or future researchers so desire.

- (k) To reseed the site with native plants upon completion of the research.
- (l) To respect the landowner(s) privacy and make a good-faith effort to disturb the landowner(s) daily life as little as possible.
- (m) To welcome the landowner(s) to visit the sites while fieldwork is underway for an explanation of progress and research findings.
- (n) To clean, sort, analyze, document, and package all conveyed materials according to current professional standards, as defined by the Standards of Research Performance established by the Register of Professional Archaeologists, and the Guidelines for Collection Organization, Packaging and Delivery established by the Anasazi Heritage Center.
- (o) To take full responsibility for permanent curation of the conveyed materials at an appropriate facility.
- (p) To make all reports and databases following from work conducted at the site(s) available to the landowner(s) and the Indian Camp Ranch HOA upon completion of said reports.
- (q) To execute "Acknowledgement of Risk Factors" agreements to be signed by the Center and excavation-program participants.
- (r) To work in good faith with the Landowner(s) to resolve any issues which may arise that are not specified by other items in this agreement to the satisfaction of both parties.

The effective date of this agreement shall be the date it is fully executed. This agreement will be binding upon all heirs, assigns and successors to the undersigned.
